Giving wings to the aspirations of underprivileged women and children.


Mission:

To provide timely, cost effective, sustainable, meaningful support to the underprivileged women and children including people with disabilities by effectively implementing projects in the areas of health, education, vocational training, skill development and social security.

Established in 1977, The Women's Welfare Society (WWS) is registered on 15.2.1980 under the Karnataka Societies Registrations Act, 1960 and headquartered in Belagavi City, Karnataka, India.

We focus on the holistic empowerment of vulnerable women through preventing crimes such as trafficking, sexual exploitation and dowry atrocities, apart from rescuing and rehabilitating the victims. We also work with at-risk and underprivileged children through initiatives like free pre-school education, health programmes and vocational training.

To further ensure the all-round development of the communities we serve, we have launched innovative programmes like Community Radio Station and environmental awareness drives. By working closely with the Government, we have set up community support facilities like Family Counselling Centres, Women's Helpline and Urban Family Welfare Centre.



Programmes:

Rajiv Gandhi National Creche Scheme for The Children of Working Mothers

Established in the year

1982

The organisation is running crèche in Hukkeri and Belgaum blocks by the support of Women and Child Development Department and Central social welfare board, New Delhi. The organisation is running 10 crèches and about 300 children are covered under this unit. Each crèche is equipped with one teacher and one helper. It is providing preschool education to children apart from education it conducts regular health check-up and immunisation to school children. It also provides daily nutrition supplement to children.

Urban Family Welfare Centre

Established in the year

1991

Aided by Directorate of Health and Family Welfare Government of Karnataka serves to the 25000 population of Kanabargi area of Belagavi city. It is linked to Vantamuri PHC. It provides health and family welfare services like family planning, immunisation, and health check-up programmes in schools. It conducts awareness programs on health, nutrition, sanitation, counselling personal hygiene to adolescent girls, Geriatric care, Ante Natal outreach program, Anganawadi health check-ups, school health camps, Non communicable disease detection camps, IEC programs on seasonal diseases like Malaria, Dengue, Chikungunya etc. Unit data management is done by dedicated software. Facility is inspected assessed by Taluka Health Officer and District Health officer.


"Sangati" Family Counselling Centre

Established in the year



SANGATI FAMILY COUNSELLING CENTRE CLOSURES 2019-20




"Ashraya Swadhar Greh" for Women in Difficult Circumstances

Established in the year Started by the support of Central Social Welfare Board, New-Delhi as Short Stay home

but in 2016 it was merged and renamed as Swadhar Greh under Ministry of Women and Child Development New Delhi. Presently 30 inmates and 16 children are beneficiary of the said program. Institution is providing free shelter, food, clothing, training, medical, legal aid and counselling services. To enhance the inmate's skill to earn sustainable livelihood vocational trainings like Basing making, Bag making, Tailoring, Pot painting, Home nursing etc are conducted regularly.



"Santwana" Women's Helpline 1091

Established in the year Aided by Department of Women and Child Development, Government of Karnataka, the 24x7 women's helpline provides support services to women facing domestic violence, dowry atrocities and any kind of physical, mental or sexual harassment. We also educate women on their rights and entitlements through our awareness programmes, enabling many more women to approach us for help. We have been able to successfully rehabilitate several women living under difficult and exploitative conditions.

Vocational Training Program for School Drop-out Youths

Established in the year WWS by support of FVTRS Bengaluru provides an opportunity to never-enrolled or early drop-out adolescent girls the chance to receive a vocational training and skill training to come out with economic constrains and helps to stepping towards overall development. For 5 years under this project it is providing varieties of trainings like Bag making, Home Nursing, Motor vehicle repair, Beautician etc.

- ✓ On an average 75% of trainees are connected to economy.


UJJAWALA: A Comprehensive Scheme for Prevention of trafficking and Rescue, Rehabilitation and Re-integration of Victims of Trafficking and Commercial Sexual Exploitation

Supported by the Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India, we run four interventions for trafficked victims - Prevention, Rescue, Rehabilitation and mainstreaming. Through our two rehabilitation centres, we provide services like counselling, skill development and vocational training to victims, while also providing shelter and all-round support.

District Consumer Information Centre & Consumer Club Activities

By the support of Dept. of Food and Civil supplies and Consumer Affairs for creating Consumer rights and duties. Under this program 74 consumer clubs are formed in Govt. High Schools. Apart from awareness programme it also registers the consumer complaints and guides them in a proper way to solve their problems through consumer courts.

"Nammur Banuli" 90.8 FM Community Radio Station

Located at Karguppi-Yallapur Village of Hukkeri Block of Belagavi District. It covers 250 villages having population more than two lakhs. It is empowering community people by the way of providing a simple and inexpensive tool for educating and creating awareness on various issues.

APD-Livelihood Program for Youth with Disabilities

Established in the year

2017

WWS works with APD to mobilize marginalized youths with disabilities. It makes assessment and provides rehabilitation-based job readiness program for scaling up their skills and knowledge for ensuring optimal independence at work places such as Retail, Hotel Management, Big Bazaar and Horticulture with support of APD Bengaluru.

Beneficiaries 2019-20: Conducted 14 camps, 825 PWDs identified, 133 connected to APD training, 135 students were given orientation.

My Choice Foundation-Safe Village Program to prevent Trafficking

Established in the year Implementing Safe Village Program (Operation Red Alert) supported by My Choices

Foundation Hyderabad. Program aims to end trafficking in different regions of Belagavi. We are providing education and awareness to school students in villages, typically targeted. Each program is for a duration of 2-days SVP and is an innovatively designed to help people of all literacy levels to learn about trafficking. We do specific sessions for fathers, mothers, young girls and boys also village Panchayat members igthening Panchayat vigilance committee.



The partnership trained the leader, the operations manager and the accountant of The Women's Welfare Society. Niranthara has streamlined and strengthened our non-domain core activities. External experts apart from inhouse experts of Dhwani foundation conducted the training sessions. Nirathara also taught about leadership role, organization processes and systems. We were given coaching in 8 areas of management namely Legal compliance, Governance, Human Resource Management, Management Information Systems, Accounting & Finance, Marketing/Fund raising/donor management, Programme planning & Supervision, Vision & Leadership. The curriculum also had exposure visits to organisations of excellence like Aravind Hospital, Madhuri (Tamil Nadu) for leadership role and Rural Development Trust, Anantapur (Andhra Pradesh) for Programme Management.
